Pupil Premium Grant Statement

2016/2017 Academic Year

At Heckington St Andrew's CE Primary School we support ALL our pupils. We do this by providing quality classroom teaching supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required. The Head Teacher and Governing Body monitor the impact of all the spending and interventions, including the Pupil Premium.

Service Pupil premium is also received for those pupils whose parents are or have been a member of the armed forces.

Key Facts

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from families who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. Funding is also given to support pupils whose parents are a member of the armed forces.

Eligibility for the Pupil Premium is also extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years.

The pupil premium grant funding received by Heckington St Andrew's CE Primary School will be allocated in a number of ways
