Dear Parents and Carers,

As I am sure you are aware, the government has announced a range of measures to do with schools some of which, such as the scrapping of bubbles, comes into place on 19th July. As a school, however, we will not be scrapping our bubbles before the end of term and we will continue with the actions that we are currently taking to make our school as safe as we can.

The opening up of bubbles at present would create a greater risk and we would potentially have to send even more children home should we have a positive case as children are currently still expected to self-isolate when they have been in contact with a person who has the virus. From 16th August, the government have said that children under 18 will not need to isolate if they have been in contact with a positive case.

I will be writing to you in more detail before the end of the term with some of our plans for September but, as always, these plans will always be dependent upon further government guidance.

Thank you for your continued support; it has been really appreciated in what has been a really difficult time for everyone.

Finally, end of year reports will be coming home next Thursday for all classes apart from Hazel Class. We will send their reports home on Monday 19th July following their return from their residential at Hilltop.
