Reading	Read every day for at least 20 minutes.It is really important to have a varied readingdiet that includes fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, poetry and much more.Readingwill be the backbone of your learning for life and is also a wonderful way to relax andtake a break from screen time and the busy routines we all have! We will help you tochoose a range of different texts in school but would also love to know of anyrecommendations you have also!Sign your diary each day, and note the book and page you are on, and your grown upneeds to sign your diary weekly.We will hear you read daily in group work and we also make sure to have at least one 1:1reading session per week with you. You will need to bring your reading diary into schooland take it home each day.
TTR	Times Table Rockstars is a really good way to build up speed and accuracy of your multiplication facts. This year I would like to recommend you try to play at least 5 sessions per week, or 5-10 minutes per day. After Christmas when we move onto fractions, decimals and percentages, your multiplication knowledge is applied frequently, so practice, practice, practice!
Spelling Shed	As well as weekly spellings in class, you will be able to practice a wider range of spellings from the curriculum on your spelling shed account. The weekly spellings we are practising in class will be tested through a 'hive' game on Spelling Shed each Friday. Just 5 minutes a day, or even 3x per week can have a huge impact on your spelling progress.
Seesaw	Every Thursday, your subject specific homework will be set on Seesaw. This will be something to review what we are doing in class. It may be further research, reading or practice of the skills learned during the week. Please complete this by Tuesday so I can check it all before the next piece of homework is set.
