In our science lessons this week, Rowan class we have learned about the different links in a food chain (producer-consumer-prey-predator). To help us understand this we made our own physical food chains.

This week, Chestnut class tested the durability and permeability of igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks. We carefully scraped them to test their durability and assessed this against their main uses. We then tested their permeability, by placing the rocks into water and looking out for the appearance of bubbles from the rock. We found that merely because a rock belongs to a certain type, this does not determine its suitability for certain uses. For example you could use granite, an igneous rock to build a work top in a kitchen, but you definitely would not use pumice, another igneous rock for the same thing. We discovered that each rock had different properties and therefore these properties determined their uses, irrespective of the type of rock they are.


